

## **NAPS Small Research Grants**

### **Description:**

The North American Patristics Society is pleased to announce the annual award of research grants for junior scholars. The purpose of the small research grant is to fund scholars who have recently completed their Ph.D. and require additional monies to cover costs related to a project.

The amount for each award will vary but cannot exceed \$1,500. The committee anticipates awarding up to five such awards in any given year.

The selection committee consists of members of the NAPS Board's Awards and Prizes Committee.

### **Eligibility:**

Applicants must have received their Ph.D. within the previous five years of the application date. Both independent scholars and those employed at an academic institution are welcome to apply.

The NAPS selection committee especially welcomes applications from scholars whose research engages a question within the broad study of patristics, which includes, but is not limited to, history, literature, theology, ancient philosophy, art history, archaeology, paleography, digital humanities, and pedagogy.

Applicants must be members of the North American Patristics Society. Scholars who are not members and are interested in being considered for this award must apply for membership to NAPS. Their membership materials must be processed by the John Hopkins University Press by time of deadline for application (January 31).

Applicants must not have previously received a NAPS Small Research Grant.

### **Applicant Materials:**

To be considered for a NAPS Small Research Grant, please provide the following:

1. *Curriculum vitae*
2. 1000-word statement outlining your project and your specific research goals for this grant.
3. A budget detailing how the monies (not to exceed \$1,500) would support your research.
4. Please submit your packet of application materials electronically to the NAPS Secretary, Brian Matz (bmatz@fontbonne.edu) by January 31. We ask that you use at least a ten-point font and one-inch margins. Materials may be single or double-spaced.
